## Tip Level Designations

- Critical: Immediate threat such as weapons on campus, planned attack, or self-reported suicide risk.
- Urgent: Violence, self-harm, or criminal activity that recently occurred or at high risk of occurring soon.
- Standard: Normal peer interaction or minor rule violations.
- Other: Tips not related to safety of students, staff, or schools.
